Subject: Monthly Summary Report for September 2014

On 9/2/14 Officer Harris responded to 13 E. Windsor Blvd. for a report of bad check for over \$400.00. Officer Harris was able to assist the business owner in recuperating his loss without prosecuting the suspect.

On 9/9/14 Sgt. Jernigan responded to a report of Fraud in the 12200 blk. of Whitfield Park Ln. The investigation revealed that victim was scammed out of \$175.00 online during the purchase of a puppy.

On 9/11/14 Sgt. Jernigan assisted the FBI with an investigation into the distribution and possession of child pornography.

On 9/11/14 Auxiliary Officer D. Grover resigned from her position with the police department.

On 9/15/14 1Sgt. Riddle conducted a traffic stop in the 30 blk. of Bank St. During the course of the stop the suspect's vehicle was towed and during the inventory search a suspected capsule of heroin was recovered. Suspect was released on 3 traffic summons a Felony indictment for Possession of Heroin is pending.

On 9/15/14 Officer Swan attempted to stop a vehicle for traffic violation on Courthouse Hwy. While attempting to turn on the vehicle Officer Swan's patrol vehicle was struck by another vehicle. Officer Swan suffered a mild concussion and was transported to Obici Hospital for treatment. The occupants of the other vehicle did not report any injuries and declined medical treatment on scene. Virginia State Police conducted the accident investigation.

On 9/16/14 the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services conducted an audit of the Windsor Police Department's firearms training program. WPD was found to be in full compliance with all DCJS regulations and mandates.

On 9/16/14 Auxiliary Officer Gutierrez was completing his Defensive Tactics scenarios at the Chesapeake Police Academy when he suffered a medical condition. Officer Gutierrez was transported to Chesapeake Regional Medical Center for treatment and released to light duty.

On 9/18/14 Auxiliary Officer Bateman's residence located in the 16400 blk. Longview Dr. was burglarized. During the course of the burglary Officer Bateman's service weapon was stolen. All information regarding the weapon was entered into NCIC. Isle of Wight Sheriff's Office is investigating the case and identified a suspect. Suspect is currently wanted for 11 counts of burglary and the weapon has not been recovered.

On 9/18/14 Officer Harris stopped a vehicle for speeding at Windsor Blvd. and Lovers Ln. Driver was found to have an outstanding warrant on file from Chesapeake and was arrested without incident.

On 9/19/14 Officer Harris stopped a vehicle in the 15 blk. of W. Windsor for multiple traffic violations. The driver of the vehicle had a suspended license and had been drinking. Prior to towing the vehicle an inventory search was conducted by Officer Harris and 1Sgt. Riddle. They recovered heroin, marijuana and prescription pills from the vehicle. Driver and the passenger were arrested without incident. Driver was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance (F) X 2, Possession of Marijuana and multiple traffic violations. Passenger was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance (F) X 2 and Possession of Marijuana.

On 9/21/14 Officer Swan responded to a Burglary at 59 W. Windsor Blvd. The suspect broke out a glass door and entered the Exxon and took alcoholic beverages. Officer Swan identified the suspect from surveillance video in the store. Officer Swan secured warrants against the suspect for Burglary, Petty Larceny, Destruction of Property and Possession of Alcohol by a Minor. Officer Swan and Officer Harris also executed a search warrant on the suspects' vehicle and residence. All items taken during the burglary were recovered along with a large quantity of marijuana and prescription narcotics. Additional warrants were secured for Possession with Intent to Distribute Marijuana and Possession of a Controlled Substance. Suspect was arrested without incident and held without bond at WTRJ.

On 9/23/14 Officer Swan wrote a search warrant for the burglary suspect's cell phone to obtain further evidence in the investigation into the distribution of marijuana. During the search a photo was recovered of the suspect with a Norfolk Police badge. The NPD Criminal Intelligence Unit was notified and a joint investigation is ongoing.

On 9/25/15 Auxiliary Officer Gutierrez graduated from the Chesapeake Police Departments 7th Basic Auxiliary Police School. The graduation ceremony was held at Oscar Smith High School. Officer Gutierrez completed over 500 hours training during the 10 month long school. 30 recruits started the academy and Officer Gutierrez was among the twelve recruits willing to make the sacrifices needed to successfully complete the training.

On 9/26/14 1Sgt. Riddle responded to Courthouse Hwy. and Bracey Cir. to assist the Isle of Wight Sherriff's Office with the foot pursuit of a suspect. Officers and Deputies located the suspect who was taken into custody without further incident. Suspect was charged with multiple traffic violations, Possession of Marijuana and Obstruction of Justice.

On 9/26/14 Master Police Officer W.D. Owens graduated from the Crisis Intervention Training program presented by the Western Tidewater Community Services Board. This intense 40 hour block of training provides officers with the skills to identify mental health patients in crisis and deescalate the situations. Officers learn how to ensure patients with mental health issues receive treatment and assistance when criminal charges are not warranted. Officer Owens is the second WPD officer to complete this course. It is the goal to have all WPD officers CIT trained by the end of 2015.

On 9/28/14 Sgt. Jernigan located a wanted subject in the 30 block of Church St. Suspect had an outstanding felony warrant for a Probation Violation out of Virginia Beach. Suspect was taken into custody without incident and transported to WTRJ.

On 9/29/14 MPO Owens investigated an accident with injuries in the 11400 block of Windsor Blvd. Driver of small vehicle crossed over the center line striking a fuel tanker in the rear axle. The driver of the car was entrapped in his vehicle and was extricated by WVFD. Driver of the car sustained multiple fractures to his left leg and was taken to Norfolk General for treatment. Driver of the car was issued a summons for Failure to obey Lane Markings.
