SUBJECT:

Cemetery Policy Revision / Mausoleum Request

Background

A member of the community has requested a mausoleum in the new section of the cemetery, and the Town Council has requested a revision of the town cemetery policies.

Specifics

A member of the community desires to build a small mausoleum in the new section of the cemetery and requests Council's consideration of amending the policy or waiving it for this purpose. There are still plots available in the original sections of the cemetery, where headstones and mausoleums are allowed, but no available plots are side-by-side.

Following the Town Council's consideration of the request and the existing cemetery policies at their August 12, 2025, meeting, Council requested the policy be revised with consideration given to headstones above ground being allowed in the new section of the cemetery, maximum height requirements of structures, and maintenance of structures in the cemetery.

WINDSOR TOWN CEMETERY POLICY DRAFT

BURIAL

Cremated Remains

Not more than two <u>eremations</u> sets of <u>cremated remains</u> may be buried per gravesite within the Town cemetery. A grave liner is <u>necessary required</u>.

GENERAL

The Town cemetery consists of three sections:

The historic section – The section north of E. Griffin Street, and east of the new section, which includes interments beginning in the 19th century.

The old section – The section south of E. Griffin Street, and south of the historic section, which includes interments beginning in the 20th century.

The new section – The section north of E. Griffin Street, and east of the historic section, which includes interments beginning in the 21st century.

That aAll lots conveyed by this deed shall be used exclusively as a place for the burial or interment of the human dead. (From deed language)

That nNo shrubs, plants, trees or flowers of any kind or character shall be placed, planted or set out on any lot conveyed by this deed, except in, on, or attached to, movable containers or devices, without first obtaining the written permission of the Town Council of the Town of Windsor, Virginia, provided that nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit (a) the placing of flowers and/or plants on any such lot in containers or devices that are made and form an integral part of and permanently attached and affixed to a tombstone, monument or headstone or (b) the placing of flowers temporarily on any such lot in connection with a burial or interment service. (From deed language)

LOTS

Purchase by Town Residents

Town residents may purchase available lots within the old and new sections of the Town cemetery, subject to the requirements and limitations of this policy.

New Policy Regarding Rates for Existing Section of Cemetery: (Revised 3/13/07)

Old section - Any existing lots in the cemetery are to be restricted to town residents only, at the price of \$1,000 per lot. The purchase price of a cemetery lot for a town resident is \$1,000. (Revised 3/13/07)

New section - Beginning February 14, 2006, tThe purchase price of a cemetery lot for a town resident is \$600. (Revised 02/14/2006)

Purchase by Non-residents

Moratorium Lifted on Sale of Lots to Non-residents:

The moratorium was lifted on February 14, 2006.

Non-residents may purchase available lots within the new section of the Town cemetery, subject to the requirements and limitations of this policy.

New Rates for Cemetery Lots:

<u>New section - The purchase price of a cemetery lot</u> for a non-resident is \$1,200. (Revised 02/14/2006)

Purchase by the Town

The policy which has been stated on the cemetery deed for many years is for the Town to buy lots back for the price at which they were purchased. Due to the fact that the price per lot has changed many times and there are no records available as to purchase price at a particular time, Council set the following policy on February 14, 2006.

Purchase of Cemetery Lots by the Town When Original Cost is Unknown:

The new policy states that the Town of Windsor will purchase back cemetery lots for a price of \$200 each, or the cost of the lot if it can be determined, whichever is greater, and the Town will pay legal costs associated with the purchase. (Revised 02/14/2006)

This price will be noted on the cemetery deed effective immediately and any lots sold from February 14, 2006 forward will be purchased back by the town at the price stated on the deed. Lot owners wishing to sell will be responsible for any legal fees. (Revised 02/14/2006)

As has been the policy in the past, ecemetery lot owners may give away their lots or deed them back to the Town. They may not deed them to anyone else. (Revised 02/14/2006)

That the said grantee shall not sell, grant, convey, give away, assign or transfer any lot, right, privilege or easement conveyed by this deed, except to the Town of Windsor, Virginia and the lot owner wishing to sell will be responsible for any legal fees. (From deed language)

Order of Sales

New Policy Regarding Order in Which Lots are Sold: (Revised 12/11/07)

Cemetery lots in the historic section are not available for purchase.

Cemetery lots in the old section are limited and are sold, as available, to Town residents only.

Cemetery lots in the new section will be sold one section at a time starting with the lots next to the old historic section of the cemetery. (Revised 12/11/07)

MAINTENANCE

Grounds, arrangements and ornamental displays

Maintenance of the grass and weeds in and around the Town Cemetery is the responsibility of the Town of Windsor. Maintenance of flower arrangements and headstones on individual gravesites is the responsibility of the plot owner, next of kin, or other person who otherwise decorates and visits the gravesite. In the event live flower arrangements are left at a gravesite for an extended period, allowing them to deteriorate and die, Town maintenance personnel have the authority to dispose of such flower arrangements as they deem appropriate. Although care will be exercised to avoid damaging these items while maintaining the grass and weeds, the Town of Windsor will not be responsible for flowerpots, artificial arrangements, flower or wreath stands, or other ornamental displays left on a grave site.

Grave Markers

Maintenance <u>and repair</u> of <u>flower arrangements and</u> headstones, <u>footstones</u>, <u>and other markers</u> on individual gravesites <u>is are</u> the responsibility of the plot owner, next of kin, or other person who otherwise decorates and visits the gravesite.

Mausoleums, Statues, and other Monuments

Maintenance and repair of mausoleums, statues, and other monuments on individual gravesites are the responsibility of the plot owner, next of kin, or other person who otherwise decorates and visits the gravesite.

STRUCTURES

Grave Markers, Headstones, Footstones (Permanent)

Grave Markers in New Cemetery Section: (Revised 5/8/07)

All grave markers must be flush with the ground. Flower holders are permitted as long as they can be lowered back below ground level to allow for maintenance of the property.

That oOnly one tombstone, or one statue, or one monument, or one headstone, and one footstone shall be placed or erected on each lot conveyed by this deed, and all tombstones, monuments and headstones shall be placed on a base which shall be flush with the level of the ground and shall extend at least six (6) inches from all sides of such tombstones, monuments and headstones, and aAll footstones shall be flush with the level of the ground. (From deed language)

For a single grave site, the marker including the base can be no larger than three (3) feet by two (2) feet. For a double grave site, the marker including the base can be no larger than six (6) feet

by two (2) feet. There must be at least a six (6) inch base surrounding the marker for both a single or double site.

Headstones shall not exceed four (4) feet in height.

The installer of the site marker shall be responsible for maintenance of the marker for a period of one (l) year after installation. This maintenance is to include, but not limited to, any issues dealing with the levelness and/or overall condition of the marker.

Grave, Boundary, Corner Markers (Permanent)

That aAll markers designating and marking the boundary lines and corners of all sections and lots in the aforesaid cemetery shall be flush with the level of the ground. (From deed language)

Grave Markers (Temporary)

New Policy Regarding Temporary Grave Markers

<u>Included in this new policy, tTemporary</u> grave markers that are placed by funeral homes must be removed after one year.

That temporary grave markers shall be removed not later than one year after burial. (From deed language)

Mausoleums

Mausoleums are allowed; however, they shall not exceed four (4) feet in height and shall be fully contained within the lots of the owner.

Statues, Monuments

Statues and monuments are allowed; however, they shall not exceed ten (10) feet in height and shall be fully contained within the lots of the owner. Prior to installation of statues or other monuments, the proposed design must be submitted to the Town Manager for review and approval; the Town Manager may submit the proposed design to the Town Council for their review and approval for any reason. The Town Manager and/or the Town Council can deny approval of any statue or monument for any reason. Statues and monuments shall not be installed until written approval has been granted by either the Town Manager or the Town Council.

WINDSOR TOWN CEMETERY POLICY DRAFT

BURIAL

Cremated Remains

Not more than two sets of cremated remains may be buried per gravesite within the Town cemetery. A grave liner is required.

GENERAL

The Town cemetery consists of three sections:

<u>The historic section</u> – The section north of E. Griffin Street, and east of the new section, which includes interments beginning in the 19th century.

<u>The old section</u> – The section south of E. Griffin Street, and south of the historic section, which includes interments beginning in the 20^{th} century.

<u>The new section</u> – The section north of E. Griffin Street, and east of the historic section, which includes interments beginning in the 21st century.

All lots shall be used exclusively as a place for the burial or interment of the human dead. (From deed language)

No shrubs, plants, trees or flowers of any kind or character shall be placed, planted or set out on any lot conveyed by this deed, except in, on, or attached to, movable containers or devices, provided that nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit (a) the placing of flowers and/or plants on any such lot in containers or devices that are made and form an integral part of and permanently attached and affixed to a tombstone, monument or headstone or (b) the placing of flowers temporarily on any such lot in connection with a burial or interment service. (From deed language)

LOTS

Purchase by Town Residents

Town residents may purchase available lots within the old and new sections of the Town cemetery, subject to the requirements and limitations of this policy.

Old section - The purchase price of a cemetery lot for a town resident is \$1,000. (Revised 3/13/07)

New section - The purchase price of a cemetery lot for a town resident is \$600. (Revised 02/14/2006)

Purchase by Non-residents

Non-residents may purchase available lots within the new section of the Town cemetery, subject to the requirements and limitations of this policy.

New section - The purchase price of a cemetery lot for a non-resident is \$1,200. (Revised 02/14/2006)

Purchase by the Town

The Town of Windsor will purchase back cemetery lots for a price of \$200 each, or the cost of the lot if it can be determined, whichever is greater, and the Town will pay legal costs associated with the purchase. This price will be noted on the cemetery deed effective immediately and any lots sold from February 14, 2006, forward will be purchased back by the town at the price stated on the deed. (Revised 02/14/2006)

Cemetery lot owners may give away their lots or deed them back to the Town. They may not deed them to anyone else. (Revised 02/14/2006)

Order of Sales

Cemetery lots in the historic section are not available for purchase.

Cemetery lots in the old section are limited and are sold, as available, to Town residents only. Cemetery lots in the new section will be sold one section at a time starting with the lots next to the historic section of the cemetery. (Revised 12/11/07)

MAINTENANCE

Grounds, arrangements and ornamental displays

Maintenance of the grass and weeds in and around the Town Cemetery is the responsibility of the Town of Windsor. Maintenance of flower arrangements on individual gravesites is the responsibility of the plot owner, next of kin, or other person who otherwise decorates and visits the gravesite. In the event live flower arrangements are left at a gravesite for an extended period, allowing them to deteriorate and die, Town maintenance personnel have the authority to dispose of such flower arrangements as they deem appropriate. Although care will be exercised to avoid damaging these items while maintaining the grass and weeds, the Town of Windsor will not be responsible for flowerpots, artificial arrangements, flower or wreath stands, or other ornamental displays left on a grave site.

Grave Markers

Maintenance and repair of headstones, footstones, and other markers on individual gravesites are the responsibility of the plot owner, next of kin, or other person who otherwise decorates and visits the gravesite.

Mausoleums, Statues, and other Monuments

Maintenance and repair of mausoleums, statues, and other monuments on individual gravesites are the responsibility of the plot owner, next of kin, or other person who otherwise decorates and visits the gravesite.

STRUCTURES

Grave Markers, Headstones, Footstones (Permanent)

Only one tombstone, or one statue, or one monument, or one headstone, and one footstone shall be placed or erected on each lot, and all tombstones, monuments and headstones shall be placed on a base which shall be flush with the level of the ground and shall extend at least six (6) inches from all sides of such tombstones, monuments and headstones. All footstones shall be flush with the level of the ground. (From deed language)

For a single grave site, the marker including the base can be no larger than three (3) feet by two (2) feet. For a double grave site, the marker including the base can be no larger than six (6) feet by two (2) feet. There must be at least a six (6) inch base surrounding the marker for both a single or double site. Headstones shall not exceed four (4) feet in height.

The installer of the site marker shall be responsible for maintenance of the marker for a period of one (I) year after installation. This maintenance is to include, but not limited to, any issues dealing with the levelness and/or overall condition of the marker.

Grave, Boundary, Corner Markers (Permanent)

All markers designating and marking the boundary lines and corners of all sections and lots in the aforesaid cemetery shall be flush with the level of the ground. (From deed language)

Grave Markers (Temporary)

Temporary grave markers that are placed by funeral homes must be removed after one year.

Mausoleums

Mausoleums are allowed; however, they shall not exceed four (4) feet in height and shall be fully contained within the lots of the owner.

Statues, Monuments

Statues and monuments are allowed; however, they shall not exceed ten (10) feet in height and shall be fully contained within the lots of the owner. Prior to installation of statues or other monuments, the proposed design must be submitted to the Town Manager for review and approval; the Town Manager may submit the proposed design to the Town Council for their review and approval for any reason. The Town Manager and/or the Town Council can deny

approval of any statue or monument for any reason. Statues and monuments shall not be installed until written approval has been granted by either the Town Manager or the Town Council.

CREMATION BURIAL POLICY

Cremation

Not more than two cremations may be buried per gravesite within the Town cemetery. A grave liner is necessary.

POLICY FOR MAINTENANCE OF TOWN CEMETERY

Maintenance of the grass and weeds in and around the Town Cemetery is the responsibility of the Town of Windsor. Maintenance of flower arrangements and headstones on individual gravesites is the responsibility of the plot owner, next of kin, or other person who otherwise decorates and visits the gravesite. In the eyent live flower arrangements are left at a gravesite for an extended period, allowing them to deteriorate and die, Town maintenance personnel have the authority to dispose of such flower arrangements as they deem appropriate. Although care will be exercised to avoid damaging these items while maintaining the grass and weeds, the Town of Windsor will not be responsible for flower pots, artificial arrangements, flower or wreath stands, or other ornamental displays left on a grave site.

CEMETERY POLICIES

SALE OF LOTS BACK TO THE TOWN OF WINDSOR NEW RATES TEMPORARY GRAVE MARKERS NEW AREA – NO STONES ABOVE GROUND LEVEL

The policy which has been stated on the cemetery deed for many years is for the Town to buy lots back for the price at which they were purchased. Due to the fact that the price per lot has changed many times and there are no records available as to purchase price at a particular time, Council set the following policy on February 14, 2006.

Purchase of Cemetery Lots by the Town When Original Cost is Unknown:

The new policy states that the Town of Windsor will purchase back cemetery lots for a price of \$200 each, or the cost of the lot if it can be determined, whichever is greater, and the Town will pay legal costs associated with the purchase. As has been the policy in the past, cemetery lot owners may give away their lots or deed them back to the Town. They may not deed them to anyone else.

New Rates for Cemetery Lots:

Beginning February 14, 2006, the purchase price of a cemetery lot for a town resident is \$600. The price for a non-resident is \$1,200. This price will be noted on the cemetery deed effective immediately and any lots sold from February 14, 2006 forward will be purchased back by the town at the price stated on the deed. Lot owners wishing to sell will be responsible for any legal fees.

New Policy Regarding Rates for Existing Section of Cemetery: (Revised 3/13/07) Any existing lots in the cemetery are to be restricted to town residents only, at the price of \$1,000 per lot.

New Policy Regarding Temporary Grave Markers

Included in this new policy, temporary grave markers that are placed by funeral homes must be removed after one year.

Grave Markers in New Cemetery Section: (Revised 5/8/07)

- All grave markers must be flush with the ground. Flower holders are permitted as long as they can be lowered back below ground level to allow for maintenance of the property.
- For a single grave site, the marker including the base can be no larger than 3 feet by 2 feet. For a double grave site, the marker including the base can be no larger than 6 feet by 2 feet. There must be at least a 6 inch base surrounding the marker for both a single or double site.

 The installer of the site marker shall be responsible for maintenance of the marker for a period of one (I) year after installation. This maintenance is to include, but not limited to, any issues dealing with the levelness and/or overall condition of the marker.

New Policy Regarding Order in Which Lots are Sold: (Revised 12/11/07) Cemetery lots in the new section will be sold one section at a time starting with the lots next to the old cemetery.

access to and from the aforesaid cemetery and the lot or lots hereby conveyed in		
connection with the use of such lot or lots, the lot or lots hereby conveyed being

This deed and conveyance is made subject to the following conditions and restrictions which shall be covenants running with the land and shall bind and inure to the benefit of all owners of lots in the above mentioned cemetery and shown and described on the above mentioned plat of said cemetery, including

the grantee herein, for the faithful observance of which the said grantee, by accepting this deed, firmly bind__ and obligate__ ____, to wit:

- That all lots conveyed by this deed shall be used exclusively as a place for the burial or interment of the human dead.
- That all markers designating and marking the boundary lines and corners of all sections and lots in the aforesaid cemetery shall be flush with the level of the ground.
- 3. That no shrubs, plants, trees or flowers of any kind or character shall be placed, planted or set out on any lot conveyed by this deed, except in, on or attached to movable containers or devices, without first obtaining the written permission of the Town Council of the Town of Windsor, Virginia, provided that nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit (a) the placing of flowers and/or plants on any such lot in containers or devices that are made and form an integral part of and permanently attached and affixed to a tombstone, monument or headstone or (b) the placing of flowers temporarily on any such lot in connection with a burial or interment service.
- 4. That all lots conveyed by this deed shall in all respects and at all times be subject to all rules, regulations and ordinances of the Town Council aforesaid now existing or which may be hereafter adopted by said Town Council for the regulation, conduct and government of the aforesaid cemetery and the lots therein contained and hereby conveyed.
- 5. That only one tombstone, or one monument, or one headstone, and one footstone shall be placed or erected on each lot conveyed by this deed, and all tombstones, monuments and headstones shall be placed on a base which shall be flush with the level of the ground and shall extend at least six (6) inches from all sides of such tombstones, monuments and headstones, and all footstones shall be flush with the level of the ground.
- That temporary grave markers shall be removed not later than one year after burial.
- 7. That the said grantee shall not sell, grant, convey, give away, assign or transfer any lot, right, privilege or easement conveyed by this deed, except to the

Town of Windsor, Virginia and the lot owner wishing to sell will be responsible for any legal fees. Beginning February 14, 2006, if the purchase price is unknown, the Town will re-purchase any lot for \$200 each, or the cost of the lot, (if it can be determined), whichever is greater, and the Town will pay the legal costs associated with the purchase.

7. That the said grantor shall not be liable for personal injuries and/or property damages sustained by the said grantee, or _____ agents, invitees, licensees and employees, while on the aforesaid cemetery property.
