Message from the Mayor

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

APRIL 2012

Spring is finally here, and it is time for home improvement projects! Surely you have also noticed that the improvement work is finally underway on the deteriorating pavement on Route 460 at the four-way intersection in Windsor. We ask for your patience as this is a major undertaking with detours and, at times, lane closures. Please drive safely!

Our other major news is that the Town of Windsor has purchased 5.204 acres of land on route 460 beside the Farmers Bank for our future municipal complex. After doing a 5-10-15 year plan, we realized that we needed land for a police station and a town hall with more municipal office space. Also, a Blackwater Regional Library study found that the Windsor Library will need to be replaced in the future because it does not have the structural strength to support the needed books. Our agreement with the county says that the Town will supply the land and that the county will build the structure for our library. This purchase gives us enough land for these three buildings as we grow, as well as other things such as a community center. This parcel of land should meet the needs of the town for the next 50 years or more.

With careful planning and excellent budget management, Council has saved enough money to pay for the land which we bought for 15% less than the appraised value. The savings came from cutting the Capital Improvement expenditures to the "bare bones", aggressively collecting back taxes, and following new financial policies with strict guidelines for all departments. We plan to start on the police building soon, pay for it, and then construct the municipal offices within 10 years. We feel that all of this can be accomplished without raising taxes.

Council will continue to look for ways to save taxpayers money as we go forward. For example, Council has just saved the Town over \$250,000 by refinancing a previous water loan at a lower interest rate and paying it off sooner. When you see your council members, please thank them for doing an excellent job.

Distracted Driving Kills

Already this year, tens of thousands of car crashes have been caused by people using their cell phones while driving. Was that call or text really worth it? Please ask yourself that question the next time you pick up your phone while behind the wheel, or when you take your eyes off the road to tend to children, pets or program the GPS. DRIVE SMART Virginia and the federal government are recognizing April as Distracted Driving Awareness Month in order to bring attention to this risky behavior.

Driving is the most dangerous activity a person does on a daily basis, and full concentration is required. Studies have shown that brains cannot effectively multi-task; instead, minds shift from one task to the next. Therefore, when doing other tasks while driving, our minds are forced to split attention and are not 100% focused on the road ahead.

One of the most serious distractions is texting behind the wheel, which is illegal in Virginia. Studies have found a person texting while driving is 23 times more likely to crash. Cell phone use is also very dangerous; research shows that people are FOUR times more likely to get into a crash than someone driving without distraction from the phone. And because cell phone use occurs more frequently and for longer durations than other risk behaviors, it's the #1 source of driver inattention behind the wheel. There has been no difference found in the cognitive distraction between hand-held and hands-free devices.

DRIVE SMART Virginia and the Windsor Police Department would like assistance from our residents to help raise awareness about distracted driving in order to improve the safety of Virginia's roadways. Try to avoid using your drive time as your down time and instead focus solely on driving. Keep yourself and your family safe by making sure you always buckle up and make sure all your passengers are properly restrained. Seat belt use is one of your best defenses against another distracted driver. 

Spring Clean Up

Our spring clean-up is Saturday May 19, 2012. Another opportunity to clean out your attic, garage, trim your trees and shrubs and get rid of items cluttering your yard. If you have any tree branches, remember to keep them less then three inches in diameter and no longer than four feet. You must bundle all branches, and you must bag leaves and yard trimmings. Please place all items at the street by 7:00 a.m.

Our contractor will not enter the driveway or yard to get heavy items, such as appliances. There will not be any pick-ups after 11:00 a.m. If you have household hazardous waste such as paint, pesticides, antifreeze, fuels, hobby supplies, insecticides, herbicides, paint thinners, solvents, fertilizers, swimming pool chemicals, household cleaners and household batteries you can dispose of it free of charge at the Isle of Wight Transfer Station, 13191 Foursquare Road, Smithfield 757-961-3874 or the Staves Mill Convenient Center on Staves Mill Road 757-242-3597. You may recycle used motor oil at both locations.




