# THE MAYOR'S MESSAGE OCTOBER, 2014

I hope you and your family are looking forward to the beautiful days of fall. The Town and the Windsor Young Professional Organization are planning a day to celebrate the beginning of autumn on Saturday, October 4<sup>th</sup>. There will be a Touch-a-Truck event for children to explore and enjoy from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. and a great band from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m., among other things for the whole family to enjoy, which will be located on Duke Street.



I want to thank all the people who have made our new town entrance signs possible. Councilman Durwood Scott has given generously of his time the last three years to make this project an affordable reality. I also want to thank Robert Eley and Essroc Cement who both made generous donations to help the Town with the cost of the signs. Our previous signs were made of wood and were beyond repair with whole sections falling off due to rot. The new signs are made of a material which will last much longer, and the back is protected by the brick to give them even more longevity. The letters are carved into the material of the sign and can easily be repainted, if needed, in the future. We feel that these signs are not only attractive but will save the Town a lot of money in the future. We will be adding landscaping this fall for the signs on 460. If any civic groups or citizen would like to help with this, please let me know.

Our Council believes it is important to anticipate and plan for the more expensive items the Town will need in the future. This allows us to save a little money each year until we can afford them without having to raise taxes. We instituted financial policies about five years ago which include strict line item budgets for every department in our Town. Money cannot be moved from one line item to another even within the same department without Council's approval. This allows Council to scrutinize all spending carefully. Our staff also does a great job finding ways to save the Town and our taxpayers money. Because of this commitment from Council and staff, we have accomplished our goal of not raising the \$0.10 real estate tax (which is the lowest rate of any town in this area) over the last four years even though our costs continue to rise.

I want to thank the outstanding people who make up this Council and with whom I have had the privilege to work the last four years. Their job is not always easy! Sometimes they have had to make difficult decisions with no good choice available, and they have courageously chosen the one that is better than the rest for our citizens. They have given selflessly of their time and money. Most refuse reimbursement for their travel on behalf of the Town, some do not take any stipend, and others contribute food, etc. for long meetings so the Town will not have to purchase it. They do it all because they love this Town and the people in it.

Thank you for all your support and encouragement over the last four years that I have been Mayor. Don't forget to vote in the election on November 4<sup>th</sup>.

# **Distracted Driving Awareness**

Already this year, tens of thousands of car crashes have been caused by people using their cell phones while driving, and I want to take this opportunity to remind our residents that texting and driving is illegal in the State of Virginia. We need to engage our young drivers in the hard conversation of, "Was that call or text really worth it?" Also, please ask yourself that question the next time you pick up your phone while behind the wheel, or when you take your eyes off the road to tend to children, pets or program the GPS.

Driving is the most dangerous activity a person does on a daily basis, and full concentration is required. Studies have shown that brains cannot effectively multi-task; instead, minds shift from one task to the next. Therefore, when doing other tasks while driving, our minds are forced to split attention and are not 100% focused on the road ahead.

One of the most serious distractions is texting behind the wheel, which is illegal in Virginia. Studies have found a person texting while driving is **23 times** more likely to crash. Cell phone use is also very dangerous; research shows that people are FOUR times more likely to get into a crash than someone driving without distraction from the phone. And because cell phone use occurs more frequently and for longer durations than other risk behaviors, it's the #1 source of driver inattention behind the wheel. There has been no difference found in the cognitive distraction between hand-held and hands-free devices.

DRIVE SMART Virginia and the Windsor Police Department want to help raise awareness about distracted driving in order to improve the safety of Virginia's roadways. Try to avoid using your drive time as your down time, and instead focus solely on driving. Keep yourself and your family safe by making sure you always buckle up, and make sure all your passengers are properly restrained. Seat belt use is one of your best defenses against another distracted driver. # To help ensure this Halloween is a safe and happy holiday for you and your family

## **Costume Suggestions:**

- Keep costumes short to prevent trips, falls and other bumps in the night.
- Wear light or bright colored costumes and use light reflective tape.
- Children shouldn't wear a mask; it restricts vision. If a mask must be worn, cut large eye holes. Make-up is much safer than a mask because it doesn't obstruct vision.
- Toy weapons, wands, brooms, etc. should be made of paper or cardboard; they are safer than plastic, wood or metal.
- Put the child's name, address and phone number on the inside of their costume in case of an accident or lost child.

#### Trick or Treat Safely:

- Eat a full meal prior to going out so your child won't be tempted to eat treats before they can be properly checked out. Tell your children not to eat treats until you have checked them out.
- Plan your child's route and visit only homes in your neighborhood that are well lighted.
- Remind them not to take short cuts through backyards, alleys or playing fields.
- Travel in a group or with an adult. Do not let children go alone.
- Carry a flashlight or glow stick.
- Cross streets at corners, never from between two vehicles.
- Walk on the sidewalk or walk facing traffic if there are no sidewalks.
- Watch for cars driving into or backing out of driveways.

#### Treats -- Give Them A Safety Check:

- Check for holes or loose wrappers, pour powdered candy into a container and look for discoloration or lumps.
- Don't eat opened candy, fruit, etc., unless you know the person it came from.
- Wash fruit, and then cut it into bite-size pieces.

# **Fall Cleanup**

The Town of Windsor's fall cleanup will be **Saturday, December 13, 2014**. The Town offers two special trash pickups per year. This provides you with a great opportunity to clean out your attic and garage, trim your trees, or get rid of items cluttering your yard. If you have any tree branches, please keep them less than three inches in diameter and no longer than four feet. You must bundle all branches and bag leaves or other yard trimmings. Place all items at the street by 7:00 a.m.

The contractor will not enter your driveway or yard to get heavy items, such as appliances, and he will not make pick-ups after 11:00 a.m. because the land fill closes at noon.

The contractor will not pick up items such as used lumber, roofing, siding, tires, paints, batteries, gas cylinders, oil, asbestos, animal carcasses, or hazardous materials.

If you have household hazard waste, you can dispose of it free of charge at the Isle of Wight Transfer Station, 13191 Foursquare Road, Smithfield on the fourth Saturday of each month from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. They also take paint, pesticides, antifreeze, fuels, hobby supplies, insecticides, paint thinners and solvents, fertilizers, swimming pool chemicals, household cleaners and household batteries. The Transfer Station on Stave Mill Road will take refrigerators and freezers. You may recycle used motor oil at both locations.

# Recycling

Recycling has been made easy for Windsor residents. Recycling bins are located at Windsor Middle School for your convenience. Residents cannot put food in their trash bags to recycle, but anything else that is acceptable for your normal trash pick up can be put in the same bag. No separation of different types of items is needed. RECYCLE, SAVE THE COUNTY MONEY (help keep the tax rate lower), AND HELP THE ENVIRONMENT!

### **Business License**

All persons or businesses who do business in the town of Windsor must obtain a business license. All business license shall be due and payable on January 1 of each year, and if not paid by March 1 of the year for which assessed, a penalty of 10% of the amount of the license tax shall be imposed along with a \$30.00 administrative fee. Peddlers are able to purchase a peddlers license for the amount of \$50.00 per day at the town hall. Thank you for doing business in the Town of Windsor. # Grass on Sidewalks and Roads

Recently we have been receiving complaints about people cutting grass and leaving the clippings on the sidewalk or in the road. As you can assume, this poses a safety hazard for those individuals that walk on the sidewalk or on the edge of the road where no sidewalk is available. Town Code does prohibit anyone from placing debris on the road or sidewalk within the Town. We ask that you please keep our sidewalks and roads clear of any debris by blowing your grass clippings away from the road and sidewalk. We thank you for your cooperation in keeping Windsor a safe and beautiful community.

# Planning and Zoning Activities Code Compliance- Good Citizenship- Dog Owners

Dog owners are reminded that dog waste is not permitted on the Town's sidewalks and streets. This is considered an obstruction and is illegal under the Town's Code. Dog owners should make an effort to not have this happen, and if and when it occurs, the dog waste should be removed. You may purchase a yard sale sign for \$1.00, which is refundable upon returning of the signs. Thank you for your cooperation. (This Ordinance will be enforced.)
