MINUTES OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION - WINDSOR, VIRGINIA

The Planning Commission met on Wednesday, January 27, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. in the Town of Windsor Council Chamber. Chairman Bennie Brown called the meeting to order and welcomed all who were present. Terry Whitehead, Town Clerk, recorded the minutes. Dennis Carney, Planning and Zoning Administrator, and Wallace W. Brittle, Jr., Town Attorney, were present. Mrs. Whitehead called the roll.

Chairman Brown welcomed Edward Lynch as a new member to the Planning Commission and said that the Commission looked forward to working with him.

MINUTES

Chairman Brown asked if there were any amendments to the minutes of the October 28, 2015 regular Planning Commission meeting. Commissioner Edwards made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Commissioner Stubbs seconded the motion, and the Commission unanimously passed the motion as recorded on the attached chart as motion #1.

CONSIDERATION OF FY2016-2020 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP)

Mr. Carney explained that each year as part of the budget process, the Town sends a proposed CIP to the Planning Commission pursuant to the Code of Virginia. In the past, this has been late in the process and more of a formality. Staff would truly like the Commission's input into the CIP process. Please review the draft proposal, and if there are any additional projects or projects in which you have questions, please bring it to Staff's attention. He said that any comments will be presented to Council for their consideration, and an updated Draft CIP will be brought back to Planning Commission in February.

Commissioner Stubbs asked about the need for and location of the cemetery parking lot. Mr. Carney agreed to get the information on that item for the February meeting. There being no other questions, the Commissioners agreed to contact Mr. Stallings, Town Manager, or Mr. Carney with any comments.

STATUS REPORT ON THE PROPOSED U.S. ROUTE 460 BYPASS PROJECT

Mr. Carney reported that several VDOT representatives gave an update at the February Council meeting on the continued environmental work being done on the U.S. Route 460 Corridor Improvements Project. He stated that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) held a public comment period from November 30, 2015 to January 20, 2016. He said that comments were being solicited in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of the proposed improvements.

Mr. Carney reviewed the map showing the section of the proposed 17 mile Northern Route that bypassed Windsor on the north, crossing over Route 258 without an interchange connecting to the existing Route 460 at Zuni.

The Planning Commission continued to discuss the proposal submitted by the Southern Environmental Law Center (SELC) opposing the northern bypass around the Town and proposing an alternate route. Mr. Carney pointed out that this was not under consideration as a part of this environmental review. He added and the Commission concurred that because of the length of time for a decision on this project, and with the Draft Comprehensive Plan on hold, Staff should discuss with Town Council lifting the "hold" on the Comprehensive Plan.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR A WORKSHOP WITH THE CITIZENS INSTITUTE ON RURAL DESIGN

Mr. Carney said that Ms. Jai McBride, with the Hampton Roads Planning District Commission (HRPDC), brought to his attention potential assistance that would help plan the Downtown and Olde Town Windsor areas of the Town. The program is through the Citizens Institute on Rural Design. He said it is a nation-wide competition for a \$10,000 stipend in which the Town must match the stipend in order to hold an intensive 2 ½ day community workshop on the topics applied for. Staff is suggesting a workshop utilizing nation-wide consultants on how to create a more vibrant, attractive, and sustainable downtown (Windsor Boulevard) and look at the viability of the proposed Olde Town Windsor (Court and Church streets) that is proposed in the Draft Comprehensive Plan. He noted that the workshop would give the Town a product valued at a minimum of \$35,000.

Mr. Carney reported that Town Council gave Staff the approval to submit the Request for Proposal, and the RFP has been submitted. The winning RFP's will be announced in March 2016. He said if the Town is fortunate to be a recipient, the work-shops would then be held during the fall of 2016 through the spring of 2017.

Mr. Carney said that the Commission's role in the workshop will be critical if the Town is a winning recipient. He explained that the workshop would give a huge

element of our Comprehensive Planning for the future of the Town. Mr. Carney said he will keep the Planning Commission posted on the outcome of the RFP.

VIRGINIA COMMISSION ON THE ARTS CHALLENGE GRANT

Mr. Carney said that he will be asking Council at its next meeting to consider permitting Staff to apply for the Virginia Commission on the Arts Challenge Grant for \$5,000 with a local match of \$5,000. He said this grant would launch a private non-profit group to further the arts in Windsor.

REVIEW OF DISCUSSIONS ON THE OLDE TOWN WINDSOR CONCEPT

Planning Commission reviewed and discussed the additions to be made to the Draft Comprehensive Plan for the "Olde Town" Windsor chapter. The Commission suggested a couple of minor revisions to the Potential Uses list. Commissioner Willis said that a 32 square foot sign may be too large for the "Olde Town" area. It was agreed that consideration of signage would be discussed at a future meeting when the rules for the district would be actually put in place.

PLANT/TREE LIST FOR LANDSCAPING AND BUFFERS

Planning Commission reviewed a draft trees and shrubs list to be utilized for the landscaping elements in the Land Development Ordinance which are required for new commercial buildings, new major subdivisions and manufactured home parks. After discussion, it was the consensus of Planning Commission to have Staff present the list to local wholesalers/retailers and other interested parties for their review and suggestions. He said he would bring the list back to the Commission for a final review and approval as a Town policy for use by Staff to guide developers in the situations where the landscaping elements apply.

Commissioner Stubbs reported two new businesses in Town; Ramon Tires and South Eastern Armament Company.

PLANNING AND ZONING STAFF REPORT FOR DECEMBER 2015

Mr. Carney gave a brief review of Planning and Zoning activities for the month of December, 2015. He explained that there were eight new zoning permits in the month. The permits were for two single family residences, a utility building, a fence, a driveway expansion, a temporary sign, a home occupation and a roof for

an existing deck. He added that there were five new violations which were for inoperative motor vehicles.

OTHER NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Carney reported that Holland Meadows, Inc. is requesting a variance from the required front property yard setback of 40 feet to 25 feet on a parcel in the subdivision due to its topography. He said that the Board of Zoning Appeals has a public hearing on the variance request scheduled for February 16, 2016.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Carney requested that the February 24, 2016 Planning Commission meeting be rescheduled to February 17, 2016 due to a training class on Flood Plains that he has to attend that conflicts with the regular February 24, 2016 meeting. Planning Commission agreed to reschedule the meeting to February 17, 2016. Mr. Carney thanked the Commission for their assistance on this matter.

There being no further business, Commissioner Stubbs made the motion to adjourn. Commissioner Edwards seconded the motion, and the Planning Commission unanimously approved the motion as recorded on the attached chart as motion #2.

Subject: Revisions to the Draft Comprehensive Plan

The Draft Comprehensive Plan has been on hold for several months pending decisions that are being made at the State level on the Northern Bypass for the U.S. Route 460 project. Because a "final" decision on the project will not be made for at least two years, the Planning Commission has been given permission to make any revisions to the Plan necessary in order to move the Plan towards adoption.

The current Draft Plan is predicated on the Southern Bypass approach. It is suggested that at the March meeting, a work-session would be held at the end of the meeting. At the work session, the Commission should consider removing the Southern Bypass Routes from the map and possibly several of the proposed commercial and residential expansions near the former Southern Bypass interchange area. The deletion of the Southern Bypass from the map is because it is not being considered as a viable alternative. Because some of the "new" commercial and residential areas that are on the present Future Land Use Map were thought to arise from the Southern Bypass, they may need to be amended also. Leaving some of them in could cause major transportation and infrastructure problems should they develop without an adequate road system.

Staff will review the Draft Plan for the areas where changes may need to be made prior to the work-session to facilitate the discussion. The Hampton Roads Planning District will be contacted so that the Map can be revised again. Staff will also write the verbiage concerning a possible future U.S. Route 460 Bypass. If the Northern Bypass remains an option that would go to construction, the Commission could revisit its impacts either as a separate amendment to this Plan or in the next overall Comprehensive Plan revision. Also some of the work that has been done on the "Olde Town Windsor Overlay area could be included in the final draft.

Please contact Staff if any Commission member needs a copy of the current Draft Comprehensive Plan. We have provided a copy in this agenda packet for our new member, Mr. Ed Lynch.

Subject: January 2016 Planning and Zoning Report

Zoning Permits: The number of Zoning Permits decreased in January to four from the eight in December. Also this is decidedly less than the ten permits issued in January 2015. The permits were for a small business addition for a foyer, a utility building, a permanent sign and a new business in an existing building.

Violations: New violations increased to seven in January. This is an increase from the five in December. All of these were for inoperative motor vehicles. This is more than the four violations in January 2015. One inoperative vehicle case was resolved last month.

Planning Commission Activity: The Planning Commission met and gave their general assent to the additions to be made to the Draft Comprehensive Plan for the "Olde Town Windsor chapter with a couple of minor changes. It also reviewed a draft trees and shrubs list to be utilized for the landscaping elements in the Land Development Ordinance which are required (new commercial buildings, new major subdivisions and manufactured home parks).

There was a lengthy discussion of the new Northern Route for the U.S. Route 460 Bypass. Because of the length of time for the Bypass project to be decided, and with the Draft Comprehensive Plan on hold, the consensus of the Commission members is to move forward on the Comprehensive Plan with the southern bypass route being removed along with any verbiage on that route. A small section explaining the current situation may be appropriate. Because of this, Staff requests Town Council to consider permitting the Commission to move forward on this document.

Because I have an extensive training class on Flood Plains that conflicts with the regular February meeting, the Commission graciously moved that meeting to February 17, 2016.

Board of Zoning Appeals: The Board of Zoning Appeals has a public hearing on a variance request scheduled for February 16, 2016. So February promises to be a short busy month.
