Subject:	Monthly Summary Report for January 2014

Sergeant Jernigan completed an extensive inventory and accounting of all property and evidence held by the Windsor Police Department. During the course of this inventory, several pieces of recovered stolen property were identified and returned to the owners. Several hundred pieces of evidence and contraband have been identified for destruction and upon issuance of a court order will be purged. This inventory has led to several changes in the policies and procedures to ensure compliance with state code and chain of custody, regarding the handling and storage of evidence.

1st Sergeant Riddle responded to a shoplifting at the Food Lion on 1/1/14. The suspect fled the scene prior to police arriving. The suspect stole over \$200.00 worth of beer and merchandise. Witnesses provided a tag number and direction of travel. A BOLO was issued and Suffolk Police located the suspect and 1st Sergeant Riddle was able to respond and take the suspect into custody. The suspect was linked to a previous larceny at the same location in July of last year by the vehicle tag. Sergeant Jernigan was able to obtain warrants on the suspect for the earlier incident.

Master Police Officer Owens and Officer Harris successfully completed Intox ECR/ IR II recertification training at the Virginia Beach Police Academy.

Auxiliary Police Recruit J.R. Gutierrez completed his first full month of training at the Auxiliary Police Academy in Chesapeake. Recruit Gutierrez is projected to graduate on August 19th, 2014 upon completing the all-volunteer 31 week academy, encompassing over 500 hours of instruction, being hosted by the Chesapeake Police Department.

Sergeant Jernigan investigated a report of fraud and obtaining money by false pretense at the Farmers Bank. The suspect was identified and arrested on four felony counts after uttering over \$900.00 in forged and bad checks.

Officer Harris finished a follow-up investigation into an Arson that occurred in December 2013. The suspect in the case was identified a troubled juvenile offender. After diversionary methods failed to correct the suspect's behavior and petition was secured to charge the offender in juvenile court.

The 2013/14 FY CIP police car project was completed this month. All three vehicles had the in car camera systems installed and several other upgrades completed. Kustom Signals installed the downloading hardware at the new police department and conducted training for all the officers on the use of the in car camera systems and administrative operations of the all-digital system.





During this month's Grand Jury several suspects were indicted as a result of previous criminal investigations. This month's indictments include a Possession with Intent Sell/ Distribute Marijuana and Aggravated Sexual Battery of a Child.

With 2 periods of snowfall this month there were no traffic accidents related to the weather events. Officers responded to assist motorists whose vehicles were stuck or disabled.

1st Sergeant Riddle is continuing to review all the records retained by the Windsor Police Department to ensure compliance with retention of these records. The code regarding records retention is mandated by the Library of Virginia. Records that are eligible for destruction are being identified so they can be purged.
