Buy local food You may pay a bit more in the products. grocery store, but buying locally grown products helps the earth because less fuel is required to transport your products to market. 7. Bring cloth bags to the market. Tote your own cloth bags to the store instead of plastic and paper bags, reducing waste and requiring no additional energy. 8. Put on a sweater instead of turning up the thermostat. 9. Use recycled paper. Switch your home and business paper products to 100% post-consumer recycled paper, saving countless trees and five pounds of carbon dioxide per ream of paper.
