It is my hope that everyone in this great Town had a very merry Christmas and a wonderful New Year. I wanted to briefly touch upon several significant events that your Police Department has been involved in over the past couple of months.

The 2012 Windsor Police Department Christmas Toy Drive was a huge success. I would like to thank everyone who helped to support this event. Because of that support, we were able to help well over 200 children in, and around, the Town of Windsor have a brighter Christmas. I wish that I could thank everyone individually that helped us, but I would be thanking almost every resident of this Town. I am still amazed at the way this community comes together to help one another.

Also in December, the Windsor Police Department had its first ever Touch-A-Truck Event. We originally had organized this event for our local Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts and it consisted of a couple of emergency vehicles that the kids could come and see and have an opportunity to touch and see what all the equipment in the vehicles do. Unfortunately we were then brought out of our happy thoughts with the tragedy that took place in Newtown, Connecticut. The Sandy Hook Elementary School Shooting took the lives of small children and devastated the lives of those left behind. I began to try to come up with any way possible that this great Town could somehow do something, anything, that might make even a fraction of a difference. I called on some of our surrounding jurisdictions and local business owners that assist emergency services to join us and send their own vehicles. What happened next was amazing. Everything came together flawlessly. We had the Windsor Police Department, The Smithfield Police Department, Southhampton County Sheriff's Office, Isle of Wight Sheriff's Office, Windsor Volunteer Fire Department, Carrsville Volunteer Fire Department, Windsor Volunteer Rescue Squad, Hardy's Towing Service and Dave's Towing and Chips Towing with their wreckers and support from our own local wrecker service who was unable to join because he was on a call. We had well over one hundred people stop by the event and I am amazed to say that we were able to raise over \$1,200.00 in just two hours to send to the victim's families through their local police department. I am unable to articulate my appreciation to all those that came out. Thank you is all I am able to say.

December also was the month that the Windsor Police Department unveiled its proto-type "Vehicle of the Future". Through a great deal of hard work, trial and error, the Windsor Police Department now has one of the most advanced police vehicle's in use for standard patrol operations in the country. I encourage anyone who would like to see this vehicle to please let me know and I will set up a time. It is truly a remarkable piece of equipment.

Again, thank you for all the support that you give this agency, its officers and myself. We will never stop making sure that the Town of Windsor continues to be one of the greatest places to live, work and learn in this great country. My thoughts and prayers are with all of you.
