Summer time is here, and the rain is making the grass grow. Please help keep Windsor looking good by cutting your grass on a regular basis. Don't forget, if your grass gets taller than 12 inches, then you are in violation of the Town's grass cutting ordinance.

Water Rates Will Increase

Effective with the July billing cycle, the Town of Windsor's water rates will go up. The water rate applicable to all categories of water customers of the Town of Windsor who are within the Town's limits is \$5.35 per 1,000 gallons of water purchased by the customer; however, that no bimonthly water bill will be less than a minimum of \$18.75. The water rate applicable to all categories of water customers of the Town of Windsor who are outside of the boundaries of the town limits is \$5.95 per 1,000 gallons of water purchased by the customer; however, that no bi-monthly water bill shall be less than a minimum of \$20.85. The new rates are necessary to meet the Town Water Fund's current and future needs.

Annual Water Quality Report

Each year the town publishes a water quality report for its water customers, and we are including this report as an insert to this newsletter. This report covers the period January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008, and it provides a thorough analysis of our water's quality. We check our water twice monthly for bacteria, and we check the water quality every one to three years for other contaminates. Our water quality report is for your assurance and confidence that Windsor water is of the highest quality, and it is safe to drink. We are dedicated to providing our water customers safe drinking water.

Yard Sales

It is yard sale season again. Please don't forget that you need a yard sale permit from the Town Office for your yard sale. Only signs provided by the Town of Windsor are permitted. Signs cost \$1.00, and this fee is refundable upon return of the sign. Please do not nail the signs to telephone poles or stop signs; you must place the sign outside of the public right-of-way (typically 10 feet from the road). You may place them in yards with the property owner's permission. *Good Luck*!

Some Tips About Gangs

There has been a lot of media coverage lately in relation to the presence of gangs in our Town. The Windsor Police Department wants to emphasize the point that we do not have a gang problem. What we do have is cause for concern. Our Town is geographically surrounded by cities that do have a recognized gang problem. The youth of today are more transient, which has resulted in our having experienced the effects of their gang problems. The gang lifestyle is glamorized in today's music, television shows, movies, and video games. We are taking a proactive approach to educate ourselves and our citizens on gangs, their culture, and their recruitment of our youth. We will continue to host open forums in the near future to continue open dialogue with the public on this issue. It is our goal to work together with the community to establish alternative activities to provide positive atmospheres and role models for our youth.

The following quick reference guide was developed by the federal *Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention*, and it provides common warning signs of gang involvement, but it may not be all-encompassing. Parents should look for multiple signs to indicate possible gang involvement because some of these indicators alone, such as clothes or musical preferences, are common among youth not involved in gangs. Parents are encouraged to familiarize themselves with local gang symbols, seek help early, and consider contacting school personnel, our local police, faith leaders, and community organizations for additional assistance.

Warning signs that your child may be involved with a gang:

- Admits to "hanging out" with kids in gangs.
- Shows an unusual interest in 1 or 2 particular colors of clothing or a particular logo.
- Has an unusual interest in ganster-infuenced music, videos, movies, or websites.
- Uses unusual hand signals to communicate with friends.
- Has specific drawings or gang symbols on schoolbooks, clothes, walls, or tattoos.
 Comes home with unexplained physical injuries (fighting-related bruises, injuries to hand/knuckles.

What can parents do?

- Spend quality time with your child.
- Get involved in your child's school activities.
- Be a positive role model and set the right example.
- Know your child's friends and their families.
 Encourage good study habits.
- Help your child develop good conflict/ resolution skills (see
 - www.safeyouth.org/scripts/teens/conflict.asp)
- Encourage your child to participate in positive after school activities with adult supervision (recreation centers, organized sports, youth groups).
- Take action in your neighborhood (create a neighborhood alliance, report and remove graffiti).
 Neighborhood Watch

- Has unexplained cash or goods, such as clothing or jewelry.
- Carries a weapon.
- Has been in trouble with the police.
- Exhibits negative changes in behavior such as:
 - Withdrawing from family.
 - Declining school attendance, performance, and behavior.
 - o Staying out late without reason.
 - o Displaying an unusual desire for secrecy.
 - Exhibiting signs of drug use.
 - Breaking rules consistently.
 - o Speaking in gang style slang.
- Talk with your child about the dangers and consequences of gang involvement. Let your child know that you don't want to see him/her hurt or arrested. Explain to your child that he/she should not:
 - o Associate with gang members.
 - Attend parties or social events sponsored by gangs.
 - Use hand signs, symbols, or language that is meaningful to gangs.
 - Wear clothing including specific colors, which may have meaning to gangs in our area.
