It is time for our spring newsletter and an opportunity for me to keep you updated on our Town. First, I want to again thank our Council and Planning Commission for the excellent work they have

done in planning for our future. I hope you saw the wonderful three page article on Windsor in the March 15 edition of the Daily Press and how they commended the Town for its planning for the future. I am proud to announce that Windsor also received one of two state awards for planning, given by Plan Virginia in October at their conference in Lynchburg.

Our police department is currently operating out of one room at the Town Hall, and they have a pressing need for more space. Council has carefully compared the cost of building a new police station, renting and renovating a building, or purchasing a building. The most inexpensive option and the best use of taxpayers' dollars is to purchase the Robert's house on route 460. This is also adjacent to the property we bought for our future Town municipal complex and will fit into our plans for growth.

Another need the Town has, particularly for our youth and the elderly, is a community center. We are trying to save the brick section of the Windsor Middle School which contains the gym, a very large room that could be used for meetings of different groups, classes, etc., and public restrooms. This building is very strong structurally and provides the best chance for us to have a community center in the near future. I would like to thank the School Board and the Board of Supervisors for their support of this idea. We are searching for grants and have asked the Board of Supervisors for funds for this project. For this to be successful, however, we will need the entire community, including civic organizations, churches, businesses, and individuals, working together on this. I have no reservations that the great people of Windsor can make it happen! If you or your group are willing to help, call me at 242-6606. Thank you in advance for being a part of something that will have a major impact on many lives, young and old!

If you have any tree branches, remember to keep them less then three inches in diameter and no longer than four feet. You must bundle all branches, and you must bag leaves and yard trimmings. Our contractor will not enter the driveway or yard to get heavy items, such as appliances. Please place all items at the street by 7:00 a.m.

There will not be any pick-ups after 11:00 a.m. If you have household hazardous waste such as paint, pesticides, antifreeze, fuels, hobby supplies, insecticides, herbicides, paint thinners, solvents, fertilizers, swimming pool chemicals, household cleaners and household batteries, you can dispose of it free of charge at the Isle of Wight Transfer Station, 13191 Foursquare Road, Smithfield 757-961-3874 or the Staves Mill Convenient Center on Staves Mill Road 757-242-3597. You may recycle used motor oil at both locations.

Tampering With Meters

The Town Ordinance states under section §145-6. Tampering with meters It shall be unlawful for any person to remove, tamper or in any way meddle with any water meter box, rim cover thereto, or any part of such water meter box , and under section §145-17. Violations and penalties Any person or customer found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this article, or any written order of the Town of Windsor, in pursuance therof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of \$100 for each violation. Each day upon which a violation of the provisions of this article shall occur shall be deemed a separate and additional violation for the pruposes of this article.

Grass Cutting

With spring time upon us, grass will be growing again. Please help keep Windsor looking beautiful by cutting your grass on a regular basis. And don't forget, if your grass gets taller than 12 inches, you are in violation of Town ordinance which could result in the Town having the grass cut at your expense.



Recycle with Ease

Recycling has been made easy for Windsor residents. Recycling bins are located at Windsor Middle School for your convenience. Residents

cannot put food in their trash bags to recycle, but anything else that is acceptable for your normal trash pick up can be put in the same bag. No separation of different types of items is needed. RECYCLE, SAVE THE COUNTY MONEY (help keep the tax rate lower), AND HELP THE ENVIRONMENT!

Yard Sales It is yard sale season again!! Don't forget that you will need to purchase a yard sale permit for \$1.00 from the Town Office. Only signs provided by the Town of Windsor are permitted. Signs cost \$1.00 and will be refundable upon returning of the signs.

Leash Law It shall be unlawful for any person who owns or is the custodian of any dog (s) to allow such dog (s) to run at large in the Town of Windsor. And please remember, while walking your dog "on a leash", to be kind to your neighbors and "scoop the poop".

Grass and Trash Cans on Sidewalks Recently we have been receiving complaints about people cutting grass and leaving the clippings on the sidewalks or in the roads. We have also been receiving complaints about people leaving trash cans on the sidewalks. As you can assume, this poses a safety hazard for those individuals that walk on the sidewalks or on the edge of the roads where no sidewalk is available. Town Code does prohibit anyone from placing debris on the roads or sidewalks within the Town. We ask that you please keep our sidewalks and roads clear of any debris by blowing your grass clippings away from the roads and sidewalks, and by ensuring that your trash can is not placed on the sidewalk. We thank you for your cooperation in keeping Windsor a safe and beautiful community.
